**What are the admin actions
required for enlisted members
that fail one PFA?**

What are the consequences for enlisted members that fail one PFA?

- Issued Pg13 (NAVPERS 1070/613)
- FEP enrollment until passing the next OFFICIAL PFA
- Cannot be frocked or advanced
- May regain eligibility for promotion by passing command-directed monthly FEP mock PFA. However, must remain in FEP until passing next official PFA

What are the consequences for enlisted members that fail two or more consecutive PFAs?

- Enlisted members that fail two or more consecutive PFAs will continue service until SEAOS
 - Will be ineligible for advancement
 - Will be ineligible to reenlist or extend
 - Will receive an adverse report (Significant Problems)
 - Will be detailed as required
 - May regain eligibility for advancement and reenlistment by passing one subsequent official PFA

AND

- Must obtain recommendation of their CO for advancement and retention on their most recent evaluation
 - ❖ May require special evaluation to restore retention or advancement recommendation after member passes an OFFICIAL PFA

What are consequences for officers that fail one PFA?

- Officers that fail one PFA
 - Will not be eligible for promotion
 - Commands are required to delay promotion and inform PERS-833
 - May regain eligibility for promotion by passing command-directed monthly FEP mock PFA
 - Issued a Letter of Notification (LON)
 - Enrolled in FEP until passing next Official PFA

What are the consequences for officers that fail two or more consecutive PFAs?

- Officers that fail two or more consecutive PFAs will be submitted to PERS-834 for administrative separation processing
 - If SECNAV determines separation (or retired), action will occur at PRD, unless specified otherwise
 - If Officer passes official PFA prior to SECNAV decision, processing will cease and member will be retained upon notification to PERS-834
 - ❖ Special Fitness Report may be submitted to note officers satisfactory physical fitness status
 - Will receive adverse report (i.e. Significant Problems) on FITREP

What are the requirements for granting BCA waivers?

What are the requirements for granting BCA waivers?

- Must be granted on NAVMED 6110/4 (PFA Medical Waiver/Clearance Form)
- May be granted for one PFA cycle only
- Must have two signatures (AMDR & CO)

BCA Waiver Requirements?

- Non-elective surgery to the area to be measured (i.e. tracheotomy, or appendectomy, or caesarian)
- Pregnancy or IVF treatment, and aftercare followings the delivery / termination of the pregnancy
- Conditions (i.e., cancer) or medications (i.e., steroids) known to cause weight gain

**Can members be issued
permanent medical waivers?**

Can members be issued permanent medical waivers?

- Permanent medical waivers are not valid
- Member must be sent back to MEB for valid waiver or PEB or LIMDU Status
- If a waiver is questionable, contact OPNAV N17 for review

Is a LD Chit valid during a PFA?

Is a LD Chit valid during a PFA?

- Only, if the expiration date of the chit is prior to the end date of the Command PFA Cycle
- Once expired, member is required to participate in PRT or obtain PFA medical waiver

**Is a member in LIMDU Status
exempt from the BCA and PRT?**

Is a member in LIMDU Status exempt from the BCA and PRT?

- The LIMDU message must specifically state that the member is exempt from the BCA and/or PRT

What qualifies a member for a PFA medical board review?

What qualifies a member for a PFA medical board review?

- Two consecutive medical waivers for the same condition for the BCA or cardio event and push-ups and/or curl-ups
- Three or more medical waivers for any condition in a four-year period for the BCA, or cardio event and both push-ups and/or curl-ups
- CO determines the member is not mission ready due to multiple medical waivers

What if a member refuses to take the PFA? Is this a failure?

What if a member refuses to take the PFA? Is this a failure?

- At the end of each PFA cycle, the CO has authority to determine whether non-participation was authorized or unauthorized
- All unauthorized non-participation shall be designated as “UA” in PRIMIS and scored as a PFA failure

How can a CFL correct an error in PRIMS?

How can a CFL correct an error in PRIMS?

- Current Cycle
 - CFL can edit records up to 3 months
 - CFL cannot change BCA participant status to non-participant
 - There is no time limit on entering a missing record
- Previous Cycle(s) (up to 1 year)
 - Command must submit a LOC signed by CO
 - Along with supporting documents to OPNAV N17 (include original hand written PFA sheets)
 - Forms on Physical Readiness Program website
 - CFL may not sign LOC by direction

Do PFA results apply if a member transfers to or from Navy Reserve or commissioning program?

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- Yes
- PFA data is still valid for 3 calendar years

How are PFAs tracked?

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- Day for Day

Are PFAs required during deployments?

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- If official PFA notification has been provided and CO supports it, go for it
- If due to operational commitments, a PFA would not be feasible
 - Participant PRT status is "DEP/OP" in PRIMIS
 - BCA is still completed
 - ISIC approval required for:
 - Any BCA DEP/OP
 - More than 2 PRT DEP/OP in a row
 - Keep a memo for the record

What is the Bad Day rule?

What is the Bad Day rule?

- CO may authorize one retest to pass the PRT portion of the current PFA cycle
- Member must request a “Bad Day” within 24 hours of completing the PRT
- If approved, the retest must be administered within 7 days of the initial PRT and within the same PFA cycle for which the “Bad Day” was requested (Drilling reservists must retest by the end of the following month)
- Member must retake all components of the PRT
- “Bad Day” option does not apply to the BCA

Bad Day Rule (Cont.)

- If the individual is approved for a “Bad Day” but:
 - does not participate in the retest,
 - becomes “medically waived” before the retest, or
 - transfers to another assignment before the retest
- Enter the initial test score into PRIMS as the official PFA

Who can I enroll in FEP?

Who can I enroll in FEP?

- Members, who fail the PFA, are automatically enrolled in FEP
- Spot-check failure
- Members exceeding age-adjusted body fat standards
- Any member may self-enroll with their CFL
- Discuss with CO for local policy
 - Borderline PFA performance?
 - Check-in BCA failures?
 - Command PT UA?
- Document process for non-failure enrollment to avoid discrimination (Amend Page-13)

What local Command Policies should be published regarding the Physical Readiness Program?

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- Command PT during working hours?
- Days and times of FEP?
- Managing UA for FEP or PFA?
- Check-in BCA for all personnel?
- Enroll in FEP for a check-in BCA failure?

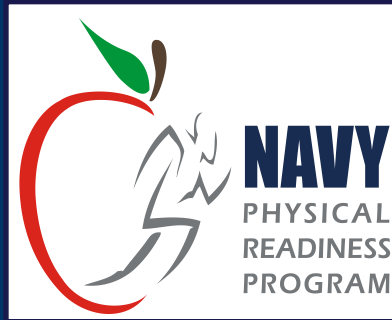
