MWR Bass Fishing Tournament Rules
Tuesday, May 17

- 1. Registration.** Teams will consist of 2 individuals. You must register your team at the MWR Office by Tuesday, May 10. Each team must designate a team manager who shall have sole responsibility for registering the team in person at the tournament site. You must check in at Jones Pond by 0800 on Tuesday, May 17. Failure to check in on time will result in disqualification from the tournament.
- 2. Location.** The fishing tournament will take place at Jones Pond on Cheatham Annex.
- 3. Tournament Hours.** Competition hours will be 0800-1230. Late arrival at the check-in point at the end of competition hours shall not be excused. No make-up time shall be granted for any reason to any participant who has been unable to compete during any part of the tournament. All competitors must check in with tournament officials at the official check-in site by the finish time of 1230. Failure to do so will result in a penalty of 1 pound per minute or portion of a minute deducted from the competitor's total weight of catch for that day, including any weight to be counted toward a "lunker award". Any competitor who is more than 15 minutes late will lose all credits for that day's catch. There will be no acceptable excuses for tardiness.
- 4. Equipment.** A jon boat, trolling motor and life jackets will be provided. You must provide your own pole and bait. Fishing tackle shall be limited to casting, spinning and spin-casting rods and reels, and artificial lures. Live baits or natural baits are prohibited and shall not be present in boats during competition except that skin, feathers and hair of non-aquatic animals may be used as lure components subject to approval by the Tournament Committee. As many sets of tackle, which include rod, reel, line and lure, may be kept in competition boats as participants' desire. Only one such set may be in actual use at any one time.
- 5. Bass Defined.** Bass shall be defined as any of the species known as large-mouth bass (*Micropterus Salmoides*), smallmouth bass (*Micropterus Dolomieu*), spotted bass (*Micropterus Punctulatus*), suwannee bass (*Micropterus Notius*), redeye bass (*Micropterus Coosae*), and guadalupe bass (*Micropterus Treculi*).
- 6. Ethics, Sportsmanship & Personal Conduct.** All participants shall observe high standards of ethics, sportsmanship and personal conduct. They shall obey all of the laws, and the authorities having jurisdiction in the tournament area. They shall keep themselves informed and aware of the rules, laws and conditions applicable to the tournament. They shall yield to all other recreational users of the Tournament resource, sufficient distance or other courtesies to avoid interference with their activities. No alcoholic beverages shall be permitted in competition boats during competition hours. Participants shall yield to inspection by tournament officials at any time during the tournament.
- 7. Handling of Fish at Check-In and During the Weigh-In.** All fish present in a competitor's boat when he/she checks in at the check-in point become the property of the Tournament Committee. Discarding or transferring any fish will result in immediate disqualification. The practice of culling and measuring after check-in is prohibited. All fish shall be placed in containers supplied by the Tournament Committee for transport to the scoring area. Water shall be added to reduce injury. All fish that are alive at the completion of the scoring procedure shall be returned to the water by tournament officials.

8. Tournament Creel & Size Limit. At no time shall a team have more than five fish in their boat. Possession of more than five fish will result in disqualification. The minimum acceptable length of fish will be **12 inches**. Any fish which does not meet the minimum acceptable length will be removed from the competitors catch and the competitor will be assessed a one pound penalty for each short fish deducted from the total weight of his remaining legal fish. Any fish presented for weigh-in, which is judged to be dead will result in an .25-ounce penalty for each such fish, deducted from the total weight of fish.

9. Scoring. Each team's score will be the weight of the legal bass, minus penalties caught and kept during competition hours. The team with the greatest accumulated weight will be the winner. Total weights will be arranged in descending order for other places. All ties will be determined first by the number of fish caught and then by the flip of a coin.

10. Explain Event Execution:

Try Outs were held the week of March 27 & April 3. Judges narrowed down the contestants to the top 20.

The top 20 contestants were recorded live April 17 - 21 by the Media Department. Media then made a video to be shown on Site TV.

On April 24, 25 & 26 the Top 20 of Bush's Talent Competition aired on Site TV and sailors were able to vote for contestants over e-mail. The crew narrowed down the contestants to the top 8.

On May 5, a finale show, with the top 8 contestants, was held in Hangar Bay 2.

Finale Timeline:

1600: Set up of Hangar Bay 2 Began. Stage was set up by G-1. 200 chairs were set up by MWR Committee volunteers. Judges table and sound system was set up.

1800: Judges met to go over judge's scorer sheet & contestants started sound check.

1830: Finale started

2000: Event ended

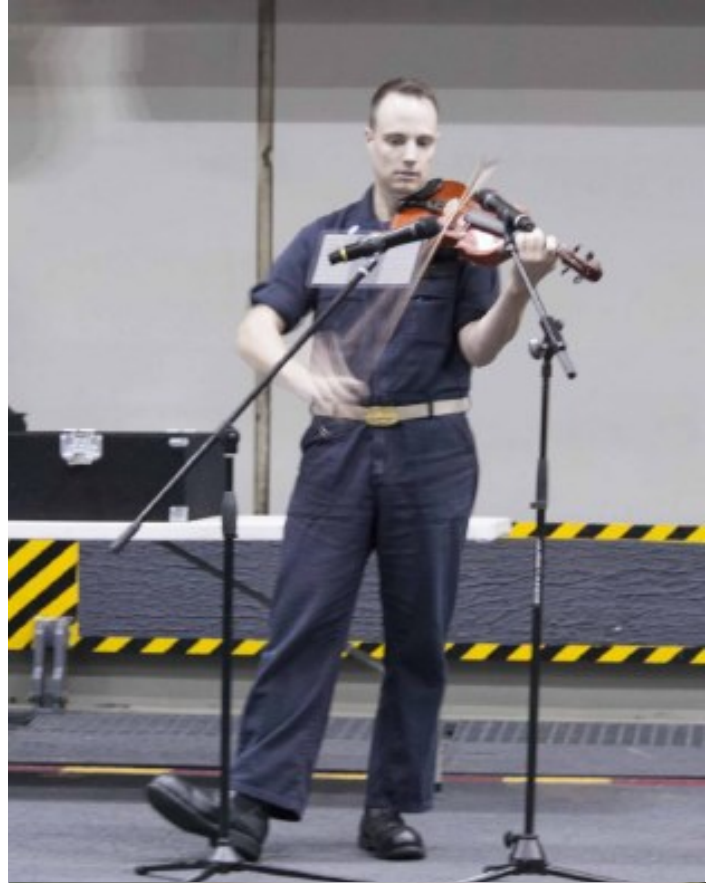

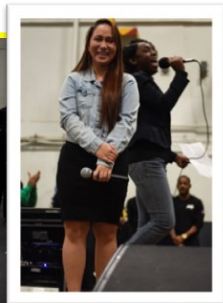

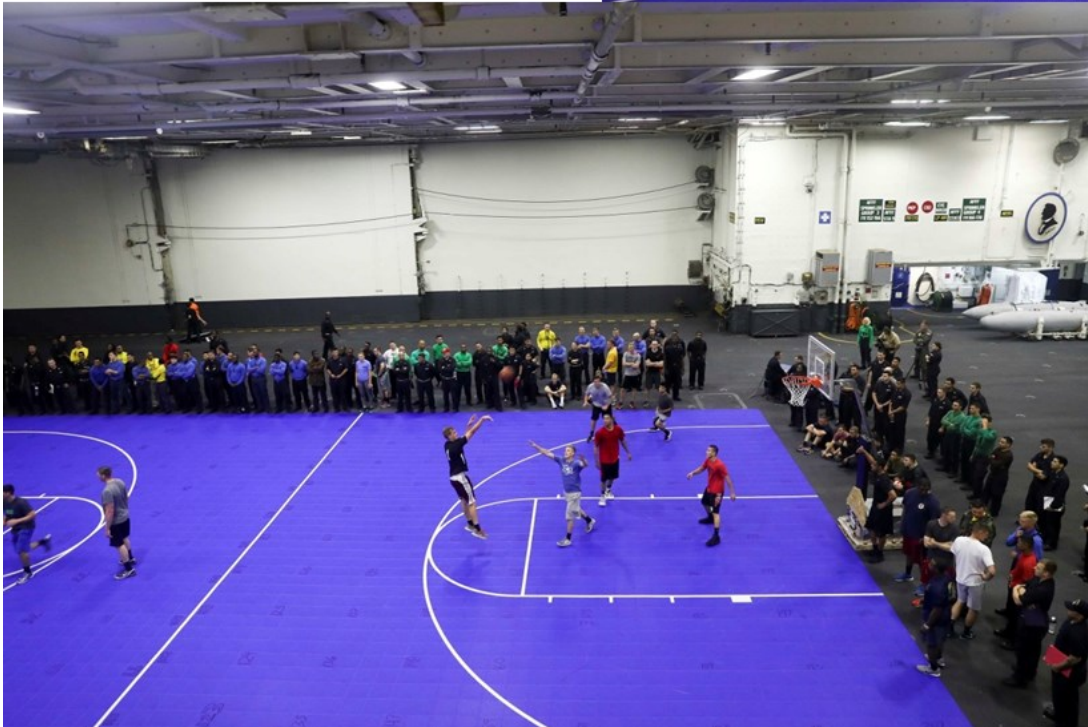
